IN RE: Welcomes New Editors

David W. deBruin, Esquire and Seth L. Thompson, Esquire, will serve as new editors of IN RE:, joining Michael L. Sensor on the Editorial Board. deBruin replaces Ian Connor Bifferato, who served as editor from 2001 to 2007 and Thompson replaces David J. Weidman, who served as editor from 2003 to 2007. Sensor joined the Editorial Board in 2007, replacing Yvonne Takvorian Saville, who served as editor from 2003 to 2007.

Michael L. Sensor received his Juris Doctor from Duquesne University School of Law in Pittsburgh, PA, where he was active in trial advocacy competitions and was named to the Justice Louis Manderino Honor Society and the Order of the Barristers. He was admitted to practice in Delaware, New Jersey, and the United States District Court for the District of Delaware in 1996, and to the United States Supreme Court in 2002.

From the time of his admission to the bar, Sensor was employed by the Law Offices of James T. Perry; he was named a partner in the firm in 2003, at which time it became Perry & Sensor. He is a member of Phi Alpha Delta Law Fraternity, International, American Bar Association, Delaware State Bar Association, American Association for Justice, and the Delaware Trial Lawyers Association, where he has served on the Board of Governors since 2002.

Currently, Sensor is the co-editor of the Delaware Trial Lawyers Association's magazine, *Advocate*, and he also writes the monthly restaurant review in *IN RE:*, "The Judicial Palate."

His areas of practice include representing both plaintiffs and defendants in worker's compensation, personal injury, and insurance disputes, as well as guardianships and estates. He also maintains an active criminal defense practice, representing clients charged with criminal violations as well as DUI and traffic offenses.

David W. deBruin received his Juris Doctor from Widener University School of Law in 1998. David was admitted to the Pennsylvania and New Jersey Bar after graduating from law school in 1998 and was admitted to the Delaware Bar in 2006. He is currently a member of the Delaware Trial Lawyers Association, American Bar Association, and American Bankruptcy Institute.

David deBruin is a senior associate in the litigation department with the firm of Bifferato Gentilotti. His areas of practice – complex commercial and toxic tort litigation, commercial bankruptcy litigation and business reorganization – cover a client base that ranges from individuals to multi-national corporate entities. David has represented clients at trial in state and federal courts in Delaware, Pennsylvania and New Jersey. Prior to focusing his practice in Delaware, David was named a "Pennsylvania Rising Star" in 2005 by Super Lawyers magazine.

Seth L. Thompson attended Temple Law School, graduating in 2003 as a Dean's List student.

During law school, he completed the Delaware Attorney General's Office summer program, served on the Temple International and Comparative Law Journal's editorial board, and participated in Temple's Federal Judicial Clerkship Clinical, for which he was selected by the Honorable Clifford Scott Green of the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Following law school, he served for a year as Law Clerk to the Honorable Barbara D. Crowell and the Honorable Aida Waserstein, both Family Court Judges in New Castle County. He then clerked for a year in the Sussex County Family Court for the Honorable Kenneth M. Millman, the Honorable Peter B. Jones, and the Honorable John E. Henriksen.

Having joined the firm of Hudson, Jones, Jaywork & Fisher in September 2005, Thompson focuses his practice on family law, civil litigation, and criminal defense. He was admitted to practice law in Pennsylvania and New Jersey in 2004, followed by admission to the Delaware Bar in 2005. ☞
