iCivics Initiative Information

iCivics is a kid-friendly, computer-based program that teaches civics through free online computer games. It has been approved to comply with the Delaware education standards. With the help of more than 160 volunteers and the support of the Delaware Supreme Court, we will send attorneys and judges into every public school in Delaware that has grades 4, 5, 6, 7 and/or 8 to make a presentation on Law Day (May 1). The content of the presentation will be based on the iCivics program founded by Justice Sandra Day O'Connor (retired) (and developed with Justice Holland's assistance). After a brief training session on using iCivics from Franny Haney of the Administrative Office of the Courts, which will be offered in each county and videotaped for later viewing, volunteers will be ready to make a presentation on Law Day. Peoples Place Information

This year, please help us support Peoples Place, a group home located in Milford that provides a home-like environment for teen girls in the foster care system. The focus of foster group care is to provide a structured home for abused and neglected youth. These youths will likely remain in foster care until they are 18. Most of the girls placed at PPGH have sadly bounced around the foster care system and are ultimately placed there as a last resort to help them stabilize, learn social skills, and, ultimately, prepare for adulthood.

As the economy has declined, aspects of the program have been cut. With money tight, the girls rarely have opportunities to do things that many of us did as teenagers (or our children do today), such as see a movie, shop at the mall, or buy a book. Please consider giving a gift card or cash donation to help these girls. Think of any teenage girl you know and you can come up with an idea for a gift card she might enjoy! Gift card suggestions from PPGH include clothing stores (*i.e.*, Dover Mall, Rehoboth Outlets, Walmart, Fashion Bug, etc.), shoe stores (*i.e.*, Shoe Show, Payless Shoes, Rehoboth Outlets), or movie theaters (Dover or Midway).
